Inver Grove Heights School Board Approves November Referendum

During the July 24 ISD 199 School Board meeting, board members approved a referendum based on discussion and information from previous meetings. Residents of the Inver Grove Heights School District will be asked to vote on two referendum questions on Election Day, November 7. Voters will also vote for three school board members.

The two referendum questions are intended to allow the district to increase students' career and college readiness, help the district remain competitive, and stabilize the district's finances.

“We believe a reasonable increase in revenue will have a significant and positive impact on student learning,” said Matt Schaefer, school board chair. (Continued on the next page)

CLEP Exams at Simley



Simley High School offers a variety of post-secondary preparatory courses, including the College Board's College-Level Examination Program (CLEP). High school students can take CLEP exams to earn college credit for a fraction of the cost of a college class. Simley students can choose to take CLEP exams in communications, sociology, and college algebra. Students who earn a qualifying score on the CLEP exams can skip introductory college courses at nearly 2,900 colleges and universities across the country. Earning credit through CLEP could not only make college more affordable, but it could also help students graduate college on time, reducing the cost of any extra semesters and providing space in their class schedules for more career exploration.

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Increase career and college readiness

"In addition to college prep, we want to offer vocational and technical opportunities that prepare students for success in the workplace," said Schaefer, "while also addressing student behavior and mental health needs that prepare students for success in the classroom." The district does not currently have enough revenue to fully implement its strategic plan.

Remain competitive

Inver Grove's operating levy is a little more than half that of other Dakota County school districts. Increasing the levy allows the district to avoid further budget cuts, keep class sizes small, and invest in high priority teaching and learning initiatives. Remaining competitive also means remaining efficient. Of the nine Dakota County school districts, the per student amount for Inver Grove Heights is currently in eighth place, and would remain there even if the operating levy request is approved.

Stabilize finances

"The Inver Grove Heights School District has been deficit spending the last three years," said Superintendent Dave Bernhardson. "Budget cuts will be the reality every year unless additional revenue is approved." The budget shortfall is a result of state funding not keeping pace with inflation over the last 15 years, in addition to other factors.

"It's true that the Minnesota Legislature approved a two percent increase for public education in 2017," Bernhardson said. "However, this funding does not make up for years of shortfalls." Without additional revenue, students will be impacted by increased class sizes and discontinued programming, Bernhardson added.

Impact to students

The two questions would increase the operating levy paid by local property taxes and create a new capital projects levy. Funds provided by the operating levy would allow the district to avoid further budget cuts, keep class sizes small, and invest in high priority teaching and learning initiatives, such as support for mental health and behavior needs; support for struggling students; vocational, technical, and career programs; and additional college prep courses and programs at the middle school and high school.

The capital projects levy would provide funds for the purchase of textbooks, curriculum materials, large musical instruments, classroom furnishings, equipment, vocational/technical tools, computers, and software for student achievement, and would keep them maintained and up-to-date.

Cost to taxpayers

The current operating levies total a little more than half that of other Dakota County school districts. The district has deliberately kept levies low by operating as efficiently as possible. The proposed levy increase would amount to an additional \$78 annually (\$6.50 monthly) on a \$235,000 residence, which is the average district home value. The capital projects levy would add \$50 annually (\$4.17 monthly) on the same residence for a total monthly impact of \$10.67.

Community Survey Results Show Support for ISD 199 Levies

Residents of the Inver Grove Heights School District give it high grades overall and for the quality of its financial management, according to a survey conducted during the last two weeks of May. Springsted, public sector advisors that provide market research and interpretation to school districts, conducted a stratified random-sample telephone survey of 400 residents. A stratified random-sample survey aims to mirror the community's voter demographics with its respondents. Questions included perceptions of the district and reactions to potential levy options, which board members used to inform their decision to approve an operating levy and a capital projects levy for November 2017.

Springsted consultant Don Lifo presented highlights of the survey results to the school board during the June 12 board work session.

Survey details are below:

- When asked to grade ISD 199 on quality, 80% of community members gave the district an A or B. This is significantly higher than the national average of 60% A's and B's.
- When asked to grade the district's financial management, 67% of respondents gave it an A or B. When compared to 2013 responses, the number of A's and B's increased from 55% and the number of D's and F's decreased from 17% to 12%.
- More than 75% supported the renewal of the two existing voter-approved levies set to expire in 2019 and 2023 to maintain class sizes and provide support for struggling students, teaching positions, programs for advanced learners, and student opportunities in band, theater, and sports.
- More than 65% supported an increase of the operating levy to offer more support for student mental health and behavior needs, more college prep programs at the middle and high schools, and vocational, technical, and career programming.
- There was 63% support for a capital projects levy that, as an example, would provide students with access to digital content, replace large musical instruments, and replace outdated textbooks and curriculum materials.
- When asked about their support for an operating levy and a capital projects levy, 68% of respondents said they would support one or both levies. Less than a third said they would oppose both levies, and 23% said they would never support a tax increase, regardless of the amount or how it was used.

Summer Academy and Summer School Students Learn Through Innovative Activities



explore new subjects and learn through new interactive labs.

Summer Academy students found new interests during the last period of each day, called enrichment periods, when teachers created lessons by drawing on their own passions.

Summer Academy and Summer School aim to prepare students for the next school year by developing their academic, social, and emotional skills. Students focus on core subjects, but this year, they were also able to

This year's enrichment periods featured dance classes, investigative games, golf lessons, art projects, and more. Fifth graders produced movies on iPads, trying everything in the creative process from storyboarding to acting to editing. First graders imitated Louise Nevelson's layered sculptural art with everyday craft supplies, and kindergarteners were introduced to French, singing the children's song "Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Toes" in the language.

Inver Grove Heights Middle School students learned about aspects of the scientific method through two hands-on labs. Students tried their hand at the popular water bottle flip challenge in a controlled experiment. Students tested how much water they should put in a water bottle to flip it in the air and have it land upright, conducting multiple trials. In the second lab, students used lab equipment to carefully measure liquids to create a rainbow of mixtures in test tubes.

ISD 199 EARNS CERTIFICATE OF FINANCIAL EXCELLENCE FOR 12th YEAR

This summer, ISD 199 received a Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Association of School Business Officials International (ASBO). This is the 12th year the district has earned this recognition. The certificate is awarded to school districts that meet or exceed ASBO's high standards for accountability. Recognition through the Certificate of Excellence program promotes high quality financial reporting and can help strengthen a district's presentation for bond issuance statements.

More Than 100 Graduates Earn BEST Foundation Scholarships



Each year, the Inver Grove Heights BEST Foundation hosts a ceremony to recognize outstanding Simley High School seniors. Donors present scholarships to each senior in the ceremony. Some scholarships are granted to students pursuing a certain college or career path while others are given in memoriam of a donor's loved one. ISD 199 to Continue School Start/End Time Discussion for 18-19

At the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year, a committee of district staff and community members was formed at the request of the ISD 199 School Board to review current start/end time options. The review focused on research that found positive effects of the additional sleep students can get when the school day is adjusted to start at a later time.

The committee met several times last fall to review current research and determine the best possible options for the students. From these discussions, three viable options were presented that would offer a cost-neutral benefit for the district.

Staff and community information sessions were held to present the committee's findings as well as its recommendations for school start time/end time options. The committee requested feedback from attendees of these sessions. Additional feedback was gained with an online survey sent out to all community and district staff members. The survey focused on student achievement, safety, extracurricular activities, and family schedules. The committee reviewed the results, which presented a number of themes, both positive and negative.

Highlights from the survey include:

- Overwhelming district staff and community support of research on sleep and later secondary school start times
- District staff and community support that a later school start time can provide the best learning for middle and high school students
- District staff and community support for a later school start time for middle and high school students

Concerns identified from the survey:

- Possible increase in before- and after-school care costs for families
- Changes in work or family schedules for parents and after-school activities for students
- Safety of elementary-age students pertaining to sunrise/sunset patterns

After gathering feedback, committee members reconvened to review survey results and then presented their findings to the school board. It was determined at the November 14, 2016, school board work session that more time was needed for the school start/end time conversation. The committee and school board agreed to further study the impact and opportunity of each option before making a final decision. The school board determined that there would be no changes for the 2017-2018 school year.

In the coming school year, the district will revisit the school start/end time conversation and provide additional information to clarify the impact of each school start/end time option. Additional opportunities for staff and community input will also be available.

Infinite Campus Replaces SchoolView for 2017-2018



ISD 199 has switched from the SchoolView Student Information System to Infinite Campus. This August, parents and guardians will receive a letter in the mail with their unique account information. District Technology staff will be available at school open houses and parent nights to provide Infinite Campus support, and the district website will have Infinite Campus resources at www.isd199.org/parents/campus. More information will be available in the mailed letter.

What is Infinite Campus?

K-12 school districts across the country use a database system to manage student information and maintain student records. Infinite Campus is a districtwide student information system designed to manage attendance, grades, schedules, assessments, and other information about the students in Inver Grove Heights Schools.

Parents will utilize one login to see information on one or multiple children, including attendance, grades, and test scores.

Campus Portal

The Campus Portal provides families with real-time access to their information as it is entered by teachers, counselors, and staff. It is also accessible from any Apple iOS and Android device.

Parents can use the Campus Portal to receive information on their student’s schedule, assignments, grades, and attendance. Report cards and progress reports will be viewed in the Campus Portal as well, minimizing lost school-to-home communications and reducing printing and mailing costs. Parents can also update their phone numbers, email addresses, home address, student demographics, and contact information in the Campus Portal.

Campus Portal will allow students to access and submit online assignments. Parents will be able to see their student’s active assignments and keep up-to-date with their academic progress.
